FIRST AID/CPR/AED TRAINING

The Adult First Aid/CPR/AED course incorporates the latest science and teaches students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as burns, cuts, scrapes, sudden illnesses, head, neck, back injuries, heat and cold emergencies and how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies for victims about 12 years and older. Successful students will receive a certificate for Adult First Aid/CPR/AED valid for two years.

WILDERNESS FIRST AID TRAINING

Prepare for the unexpected with this engaging, hands-on introduction to wilderness medicine, taught over two or two and a half days. If you like to take short trips relatively close to medical resources, work at wilderness camps, enjoy weekend family outdoor activities, or recreate outdoors, this course is for you.

This course is great for people of all experience levels, and is best suited for those who recreate outdoors where EMS response can be expected in a timely manner (fewer than eight hours). You'll learn the Patient Assessment System, how to provide effective first aid treatments for injuries and illnesses common in the outdoors, and how to make appropriate evacuation decisions.

SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION EAGLE SCOUT AWARD (SCHOLARSHIP)

Sons of the American Revolution Eagle Scout Award (Scholarship)

Sons of the American Revolution ("S.A.R.") invites qualified Eagle Scouts to participate in the Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Award. The annual contest is open to all Eagle Scouts who are currently registered in an active unit and have not reached their nineteenth birthday during the year of application (see website below regarding extensions that may have been granted to complete Eagle Scout). Each Eagle Scout must complete an application form, a four-generation ancestor chart, and a 500-word patriotic themed essay. The Eagle Scout should enter the contest with their local chapter. Springfield Chapter covers Mason, Menard, Logan, Sangamon, and northern Macoupin Counties. The winner of the Springfield Chapter Award (\$500) will be chosen from applicants from those five counties. The **deadline** for application submission to Springfield Chapter is **December 31st**. Earlier submissions are encouraged.

The Springfield Chapter winner's application will be forwarded to the State level to be considered for the State scholarship. The Illinois Society of the Sons of the American Revolution ("ILSSAR") winner will be invited to the annual meeting (meal expense paid) and be awarded the S.A.R. Eagle Scout Trophy along with a \$1,500 cash award. The second place State winner will receive an award of \$500. The State first place winner's application will then advance to the National SAR ("NSSAR") level.

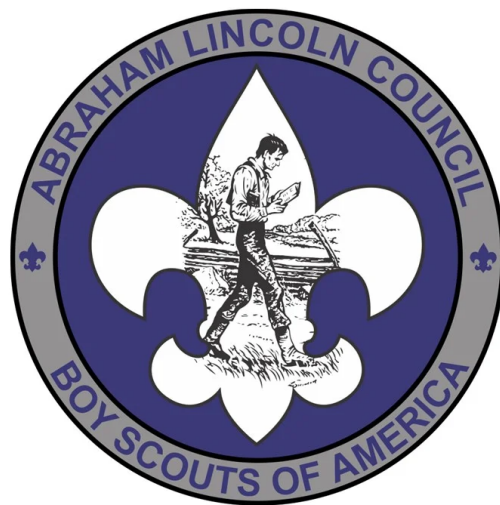
The NSSAR will then select 15 winners in the national Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Competition. NSSAR awards are as follows: National First Place Winner receives \$10,000; 2nd Place – \$6,000; 3rd Place – \$4,000; 4th Place – \$2,000; 5th Place – \$1000; 6th thru 10th – \$500; and 11th thru 15th – \$200.

It is possible for an Eagle Scout to win up to three scholarships: chapter, State, and National.

NEW ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE PROCESS ANNOUNCED

BSA Will No Longer Prorate Fees for New Members beginning August 1, 2023

Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a 12-month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining Scouting. All proration of membership fees will be eliminated. Each registered member of the BSA will receive an email notice with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the anniversary month they joined Scouting. Unit leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering.

IMPORTANT PO SYSTEM FEATURE UPDATE IN SCOUTBOOK!

Just recently, and against many local council's that operate their own independent Scout Shops, BSA IT released a new feature into Scoutbook where Purchase Orders can be sent to the Official BSA® Scout Shop. While we fully

endorse the concept and believe it could add value, it was poorly thought out and implemented. We believe that users will get unnecessarily frustrated.

Part of the Abraham Lincoln Council's charter is to be the voice of the customer. When features are released, we are normally given time to review, comment, and test the implementation in a back-end QA system. This feature was given to us with short notice, but even so, we found issues and communicated with BSA IT in time to delay release, but they were ignored. Issues include:

1. There is **NO** way to cancel items sent via Add PO Items to Cart, even if by mistake. The PO will be locked and cannot be changed, edited or deleted in Scoutbook. The only option is to actually purchase the items. We recommend **NOT** using this feature until the ability to cancel the cart has been implemented.
2. **Items can only be added to the cart to be shipped (Units are responsible for shipping costs.)**
3. If items are not in stock, a warning message will be displayed on the Purchase Order page. Listed items must be deleted from the Purchase Order before the Add PO Items to Cart is clicked again to order remaining items. Deleted items are returned to the Needs Purchase report. This is cumbersome and requires a lot of "clicking" by the user and could easily be automated.
4. There is no provision for tax exempt units to avoid paying sales tax.

Units may still continue to use the previous method, and print an advancement report to purchase items at our local Scout Shop. The Abraham Lincoln Council recommends that this method still be used until the wrinkles are ironed out with the new feature.

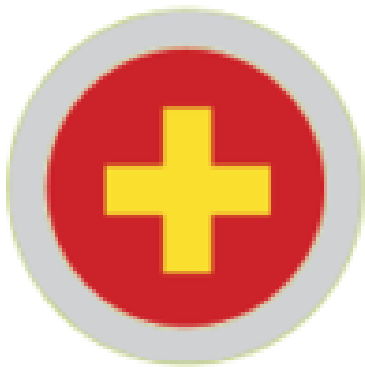
